International Peace Bureau on Women Peacemakers

On 20 January, the International Peace Bureau (IPB), of which Pax Christi International is a member, released a statement calling on the UN, governments and regional and local bodies to implement decisions on the importance of women's full participation in peacebuilding. In particular, the statement focuses on the urgent need to bring the strongest peace-promoting women of Syria into the process for peace. AFRICA

New agreement on the cessation of hostilities in South Sudan

On 30 January, the Government of South Sudan and the Cobra Faction of South Sudan Democratic Movement/Defence Army reached an agreement on the cessation of hostilities. Mediation talks took place in Addis Ababa with the facilitation of the Church Leaders Mediation Initiative, whose chairperson, Emeritus Bishop Paride Taban, is also founder of the Pax Christi International member organisation Holy Trinity Peace Village Kuron. Bishop Taban said the agreement is an important step to restore peace in the communities affected by the conflict. He also urged South Sudan's political leaders to be transparent, accountable and to refrain from embracing ethnicity and nepotism. He called on the parties to concentrate on massive energies to eradicate poverty and give peace a chance. Read more <u>here</u>. •

Pax Christi International statement on the conflict in the Central African Republic

On 24 January, Pax Christi International issued a statement calling on all parties involved in the violent conflict in the Central African Republic (CAR) – one of the 10 poorest countries in the world with a population close to 4.5 million people – to put an end to the suffering of the people and to restore human security and the Rule of Law throughout the country. The international community is urged to provide all necessary humanitarian assistance and support political and religious leaders in their efforts of restoring peace and reconciliation. On 17 January, 2014, Maryknoll Office for Global Concerns, Pax Christi Member Organisation, joined 15 other organisations in signing a letter addressed to US President Barack Obama urging the US to prioritise peace in Syria and the Middle East. Pax Christi USA calls for restoring the Voting Rights Act

In June 2013 the US Supreme Court gutted a major provision of the Voting Rights Act, making it easier for states to increase barriers to voting. In response to that, a bipartisan group of Congressmen introduced a bill to fix some of the holes created by the Supreme Court.

Pax Christi USA considers this wellintentioned bill is a start, but is nevertheless concerned about some aspects of this legislation which falls short of protecting the voice of every American at the ballot box. Serpaj Chile on International Court of Justice decision regarding maritime borders between Chile and Peru

Pax Christi member Servicio Pax y Justicia of released a statement (Serpaj) highlighting the importance of finding a peaceful solution to border conflicts in Latin America. The Justice, Peace and Development Commission of India (CBCI), a Pax Christi member organisation, launched an appeal in connection to the national elections to be held in May. CBCI calls on all Christians to demonstrate social commitment for a just and peaceful India, and invites all citizens to "be aware of the law and also the duty to use their vote to promote the common good", choosing politicians "who

MIDDLE EAST

Syrian and Iraqi contributions to EU policy

On 13 February, the Dutch peace organisation PAX (formerly IKV-Pax Christi Netherlands) will bring a delegation of Syrian and Iraqi civil society representatives to Brussels to discuss with EU policy makers and civil society representatives the need to promote citizenship as a way to not only aim at the protection of rights of people in a conflictual and threatening situation, but also to have a mitigating effect on the conflict itself. The event is entitled seminar "We are all Citizens - A Syrian and Iraqi contribution to an active EU policy on preventing sectarian violence promoting Freedom of Religion and Belief". The Pax Christi International Secretariat will be represented by Fr. Paul Lansu.

Pax Christi International statement on the Cremisan Valley

On 28 January, Pax Christi International issued a statement calling for justice to be upheld in the Cremisan Valley, near

Bethlehem, where Israel plans to build a wall on the land of 58 Christian families. Pax Christi urges governments to call on Israel to respect the livelihoods of the people of the parish of Beit Jala and prevent the further expropriation of their land and houses. Pax Christi's statement came ahead of the Israeli Supreme Court Hearing on the construction of a separation wall in the Cremisan Valley. On 29 January, the Supreme Court of Israel has postponed the verdict on the route of the separation wall.

Pax Christi Austria Statement on Syria

On 25 January, Pax Christi Austria issued a statement on Syria. The Austrian section of Pax Christi welcomes the Geneva II peace talks on Syria and hopes that this will pave the way to a just and sustainable peace for the Syrian people. While stressing that a military option for Syria is completely out of the question, Pax Christi Austria calls on governments of the EU member states, and in particular on the Austrian government, to increase humanitarian assistance for Syrian refugees and to grant temporary asylum to Syrians whose lives have been so tragically disrupted by the war.

The Austrian government is being called upon to – at least - double the quota of Syrian asylum seekers intake and to speed up the administrative procedures related to the approval of asylum requests. Read the full statement here.

Several women's organizations launched the "Women Lead to Peace" campaign, a global alliance calling for an immediate ceasefire in Syria. The group meet in Montreux from 20-22 of January. Pax Christi International co-president Marie Dennis attended. Read more here.

On 17 January, the UN Security Council held a closed arria formula meeting, organised by Luxembourg and the UK, focusing on women's participation in resolving the Syrian conflict. Panelists included representatives of the Syrian Women's League, Syrian Women's Network and the Syrian Women's Coalition for Democracy.

The meeting provided an opportunity to discuss how to strengthen women's full and equal participation in talks on Syria's future and get recommendations on how the Council should approach and support both the participation and protection elements of the women, peace and security agenda in its Syria-focused work. Pax Christi International signs onto Syria Letter for President Obama

Ahead of the Geneva II peace talks on Syria on 22 January, Pax Christi International joined a group of 17 Christian communions and organisations addressing a letter on Syria to US President Barack Obama.

The letter appealed on the US and other involved countries to prioritise peace over their own geopolitical agendas; to stop supplying weapons to any armed actor; to press for a cease-fire; to support civil society organizations committed to peace; and to work vigorously towards a political solution. An urgent call to action for a just peace in Syria

On 15-17 January, the World Council of Churches (WCC) convened a high level Christian-Muslim ecumenical consultation on Syria to explore the role of religious leaders for peace and reconciliation in Syria ahead of the Geneva II Conference scheduled for 22 January. The final WCC consultation statement for the Geneva II talks was presented to Lakhdar Brahimi, the United Nations-Arab League joint representative for Syria, on 20 January. This statement is available in English and German. WCC consultation participants also addressed their urgent call to action for a just peace in Syria to US Secretary of State, John Kerry. Pax Christi International was represented at the WCC consultation by co-President Marie Dennis.

2014 Holy Land Coordination Meeting

The 2014 Holy Land Coordination meeting, which took place from 11 to 16 January, brought together the Assembly of Catholic Ordinaries of the Holy Land together with bishops from North America, Europe and elsewhere. The aim of the visit was to gain deeper awareness of the social, political and ecclesial realities in the Holy Land with a view to supporting work for justice and peace more effectively; supporting the efforts of the local Church, through the work of Catholic organisations; and finally supporting the mission of the Apostolic Nuncio, in particular with regard to fundamental and basic agreements. The Vinzenz Community Waldhüttl, Innsbruck is a housing project for "people without a home", a community house for Roma, asylum seekers,

pilgrims and young people who, regardless of their will, find themselves with no place to call "home". The project aims to provide these people with temporary accommodation and the opportunity to meet other people alike. Petition to stop recruitment of 16 year olds into the UK Armed Forces

Pax Christi UK has initiated a petition addressed to the UK Ministry of Defence to stop the recruitment of 16 year olds into the UK Armed Forces. The UK remains the only EU country to recruit 16 year olds into the military and one of very few EU countries to recruit 17 year olds. The UN and the UK Parliamentary Joint Committee on Human Rights have requested that the UK reconsider its policy of recruitment of children into the military, that ethnic minorities and children of low-income

families are not targeted, that parents are included in the process from the outset and that the limited discharge rights for child soldiers are reviewed. The petition will be handed to the Ministry of Defence in April 2014. To sign this petition, click here.

Pax Christi UK rolls out First World War Peace Plans

On 28 January, PAX Netherlands held a meeting in Brussels with one of their longterm Syrian partners, the Aidoun group, to address the situation in Syria's Yarmouk refugee camp. The Aidoun group is a politically independent civil society group in Syria that was established in 2000 to advocate for the right of return of the Palestinian refugees. Since the start of the uprising, Aidoun has been involved in emergency support to the Palestinians and Syrian IDPs in the Palestinian refugee camps in Syria, mainly through their network of active youth throughout the country. Pax Christi International was represented at this meeting by Fr. Paul Lansu.

NGO Committee on Peace Meeting

The NGO Committee on Peace, a forum of international NGOs representatives accredited at the UN, of which Pax Christi International is a member, met on 22 January, in Vienna. Topics addressed included: special events commemorations for 2014, e.g. World War I (100 years), World War II (75 years), fall of the Berlin Wall (25 years), and the Peace Event Sarajevo, 6-9 June 2014. Franz Schneckenleithner Pax Christi delegate at the UN in Vienna took part in the meeting. The next Committee meeting is scheduled for 26 March 2014.
