Peace Event Sarajevo: 100 years after World War I

The year 2014 marks the 100th anniversary of the beginning of World War I, but it can also be seen as a way to remember that the 21st century has witnessed a world-wide rise of nonviolent actions and achievements as an alternative to war and violence. The <u>Peace Event Sarajevo</u> organised from the 6 to the 9 of June will represent an international exchange platform for debate and information on different topics related to nonviolence and peace.

The Peace Event Sarajevo 2014 is organized by both local and international coordinating committees and includes an <u>International</u> <u>Forum</u> with more than 100 workshops, a <u>Youth Camp</u> and other <u>Cultural Activities</u>. During the event this year Pax Christi International will organise workshops on justice, faith, and disarmament. Centre International pour la Promotion de la Création

The Southern African Catholic Bishops' Conference

The Southern African Catholic Bishops' Conference (SACBC) whose Justice and Peace Commission is a member of Pax Christi International, has released some comments on the "National HIV Prevalence, Incidence and Behaviour Survey for 2012" published on 1 April 2014 by the Human Sciences Research Council (HSRC) of South Africa.

SACBC supports HSRC's findings that the perception of the HIV crisis in South Africa being over is far from being true. AT the same time, SACBC highlights the lack of accuracy of recent UNAIDS reports, which suggest that new infections are declining and that the country has turned the corner in the fight against AIDS. The SACBC launched a worldwide invitation to join them as they prayed for the country on the 27 of April 2014, Freedom Day. In this day, South Africa celebrates freedom and commemorates the first post-apartheid elections held on that day in 1994 in which the franchise did not depend upon race. The SACBC expressed their support for the people in Nigeria after the recent bombings in Abuja. Archbishop Stephen Brislin has sent a letter to his counterpart in the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Nigeria offering his deepest condolences to the families of the victims. Comissão Pastoral da Terra launches the report on land conflicts in Brazil in 2013

Comissão Pastoral da Terra, Pax Christi member organisation in Brazil, has launched their annual report "Conflitos no Campo Brasil 2013" ("Conflicts on the lands in Brazil 2013"). The report summarises the information on conflicts and violence suffered by workers in the Brazilian countryside, including the indigenous and other peoples. According to the report, the Amazon is still a very violent place, since 55% of the traditional people that were victims of some form of violence in 2013 lived in the Amazon. The Centre of Human Rights Fray Bartolomé de las Casas, a Pax Christi International member organisation in Mexico, has cosigned a letter addressed to the Mexican authorities urging for measures to ensure security for women in the Chiapas region. SERPAJ Chile

SERPAJ (Peace and Justice Services for its acronym in Spanish) Chile, Pax Christi International member organisation, aims to create a space for critical reflection on specialised intervention programmes at different levels (individuals, families, communities, social networks). The first session of such programmes was held on 27 March in Los Lagos. According to SERPAJ Chile, they aim to have an increased critical reading of behaviour trajectories of children and adolescents. Read more in Spanish here.

The Puerto Montt chapter of SERPAJ Chile and "Fundación Ideas para la Infancia" organised the colloquium "Parenthood: methodologies of evaluation and intervention". The colloquium opened spaces for dialogue and reflection on approaches to positive parenting and it was led by María José Rodrigo, doctor in psychology from the University of Salamanca (Spain), an expert in the Positive Parenting Approach and Evolutionary Psychology. Pax Christi USA has co-signed asking President Obama to stop deportations. The letter expresses concern over the increased number of deportations and points out that massive deportations have not created public safety but terror among communities and distrust of law enforcement officials. Maryknoll Office for Global Concerns

The Maryknoll Office for Global Concerns (MOGC), Pax Christi member organisation in the United States, supports the campaign launched by <u>United to End Genocide</u>, the largest activist organization in America dedicated to preventing and ending genocide and mass atrocities worldwide.

On 25 March, members of the United States House Foreign Affairs Committee approved a resolution <u>urging the Government of</u> <u>Burma to end the persecution of the</u> <u>Rohingya people</u>. The MOGC asks US citizens to join them in denouncing the brutal murder of Honduran journalist Carlos Mejía Orellana, a member of the Jesuit-sponsored community radio station in El Progreso, Honduras. Mejía Orellana was covering sensitive topics like drug trafficking, government corruption, and land conflicts in Honduras. Read more here.

On Saturday, 12 April, Pax Christi International representatives attended the 100th anniversary celebration of Msgr. Jan Van Cauwelaert, CICM, held in the Parish of Saint Laurentius in Antwerp. Bishop Jan Van Cauwelaert was the first bishop of the Congolese diocese of Inongo, participating actively in the Second Vatican Council. He made a tremendous contribution to the work of Pax Christi International, always striving to highlight the importance of justice and peace in society and the church. He was Vice President of Pax Christi Flanders during 1984 - 1994. Cardinal Laurent Monsengwo, one of the first Vicar Generals of Van Cauwelaert and former Pax Christi International Co-President; Msgr. Pax Christi UK and Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament (CND) organised a debate in Kensington about the morality, legality and costs of the renewal of the Trident nuclear programme. The Trident programme aims to encompass the development, procurement and operation of the current generation of British nuclear weapons, and the means to deliver them. The debate, chaired by Pat Gaffney, Secretary General of Pax Christi UK, had the presence of Bruce Kent, vice president of CND and Pax Christi UK, who argued that nuclear weapons increase insecurity and uphold a willingness to commit mass murder. Pax Christi sections on the Global Day of Action on Military Spending

The Global Day of Action on Military Spending (GDAMS, 14 April) is a global movement aiming to persuade governments to cut military spending and move the money to urgent human needs. Pax Christi International released a statement inviting faith-based organisations and religious communities worldwide to join the "Disarmament for Sustainable Development Campaign".

Pax Christi UK joined other peace and environment groups in Central London to symbolically redistribute the £38 billion military budget to government departments with greater needs; Pat Gaffney, Secretary General of Pax Christi UK, urged those taking part in the event to work all year round to make links between issues of conflict, poverty and the destruction of the environment.

Pax Christi Flanders conducted a <u>survey</u> among people on the street asking them if the Belgium government should invest in the purchase of a new combat aircraft. Enrique Sierra, Pax Christi International Delegate at the UN in Geneva, attended a seminar in Geneva on Military Expenditure and its Relationship to the Purposes of the United Nations.

PAX Netherlands

PAX Netherlands expressed its concern about the growing use of armed drones and called for clear legal frameworks at both national and international level. According to PAX, allies must also make clear agreements on the use of information they share. The statement points out that such transparency will give the society an opportunity to influence the choices of the Dutch government. Read more in Dutch here.

PAX Netherlands, together with several Congolese and international civil society groups, co-signed a letter calling on the UN peacekeeping mission to DR Congo (MONUSCO) to improve their efforts to protect civilians against the Lord's Resistance Army. Pax Christi on conference on the Humanitarian Consequences of Nuclear Weapons

The conference took place at the United States Institute of Peace in Washington, D.C. Science and policy leaders joined to consider the humanitarian impact of nuclear weapons, and discuss pathways for collaboration between the faith and secular advocacy communities in the areas of non-proliferation and disarmament.

CBCI hosts workshops on Catholic Social Teaching

On 19-20 and 26-27 March, the Office for Justice, Peace and Development of the

Catholic Bishops' Conference of India (CBCI), Pax Christi member organisation in India, organised two Catholic Social Teaching workshops.

The main goal of these activities was to stress the need for mutual accompaniment of faith and action for justice.
